ANDREW'S STORY

A Journey Toward Independence

When Andrew first met with Connective's Prince George team, he faced significant challenges.

An attempt to take his own life resulted in the loss of both lower limbs, a prolonged hospital stay, and job loss. Once discharged from the hospital, Andrew found he could no longer do the things he once did with ease – it was a major turning point in his life. With nowhere else to go, Andrew was placed in the Prince Motel and put in touch with Connective, through Northern Health.

An initial meeting made it clear that Andrew could benefit from the Supported Rent Supplement Program. A referral was submitted, and since then, SRSP has been a great source of help and support.

"Connective has come to my life as a light."

Andrew has come far in his journey, and is eager to learn new ways of living independently. For now, Connective staff help him order groceries, go into the community, and help provide regular social interaction, through coffee and conversation.

Andrew's often tearful gratitude is a powerful reminder of why we're proud to do this work.

When Andrew first came to Connective he was noted as saying, "I will never move out from Prince [Motel], as I am not capable of doing it." Now, with the support of staff, his outlook has changed.

"Let's find a nice apartment for me, I know I can do it because of you guys."

We're excited to see where Andrew goes from here, and ready to continue supporting him!
